\$100,000 per year in total funding

- **Public entities or nonprofit organizations that are tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code**
- **Based in the United States or its territories**
- **Organizations, not to individuals**
- **Multi-organizational consortia with single eligible organization designated as the primary applicant**

- **Submit a one-page Letter of Intent to systemsforaction@ucdenver.edu by July 20**
 - **Title**
 - **Brief description of the proposed research**
 - **Listing of the participating investigators and institutions**
 - **Not binding**
 - **Not required but will assist the program office with reviewers**
- **Submit full proposal using the RWJF online system due 3pm ET August 5**
- **Review**
- **Notified of funding decision in September**

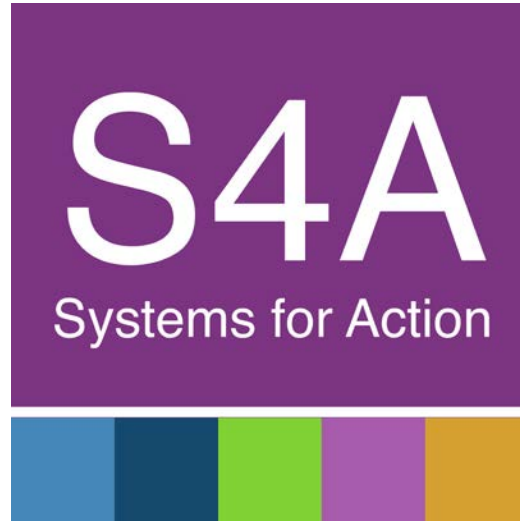
Applicant finalists notified of funding recommendations
